The Declaration of Independence



June 7, 1776: Richard Henry Lee of Virginia introduced a Resolution in the Second Continental Congress calling the colonies free and independent states. Congress created a committee that included Benjamin Franklin, John Adams, and Thomas Jefferson, to draft a Declaration of Independence. Jefferson wrote it within two weeks, drawing from the ideas of John Locke. It was meant to explain the Lee Resolution. John Locke wrote that all individuals have the right to "life, liberty, and property." Property became the "pursuit of happiness."

July 2, 1776: Congress unanimously passed Lee's resolution. John Adams wrote his wife that he thought this date would become a national

holiday.

July 4, 1776: The delegates adopted the Declaration of Independence. The United States was born ...

provided they won the war. And now we celebrate July 4th every year as Independence Day!

The Declaration of Independence has 4 parts:

- 1. Preamble (Introductory section)
- 2. Declaration of Natural Rights
- 3. List of Grievances (complaints) against the king
- 4. Resolution of Independence by the United States

Government is a social contract. If the ruler doesn't protect the people and their natural rights, the contract is broken and the people can overthrow him. King George III broke the contract, so now the U.S. is its own nation.

Actual words from the Preamble:

"When in the course of human events, it becomes necessary for one people to dissolve the political bands ,,, they should declare the causes which impel them to the separation." Means: People must state their reasons for a revolution

From the Declaration of Natural Rights:

"We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty, and the pursuit of Happiness ..."

Means: Some rights come from the fact of just being human and can't be taken away by a king. When they said "equal," the Founding Fathers didn't initially include Native Americans, slaves or women.

From the List of Grievances:

"The history of the present King of Great Britain is a history of repeated injuries and usurpations, all having in direct object the establishment of an absolute tyranny over the States."

Means: The colonies listed their justifications for the separation which included the complaints they had against King George III, followed by a lot of examples.

From the Resolution of Independence:

"We therefore, the Representatives of the United States of America, in General Congress ... do, in the Name, and by the Authority of the good People of these Colonies, solemnly publish and declare, That these United Colonies are, and of Right ought to be Free and Independent States ..." Means: We're Independent!

Did You Know ... ?

The Concept of Time is attributed to Ancient Egyptian Culture

Even though most of us think of time measured by the clock and the calendar as absolute, a review of ancient cultures showed that many of them viewed time differently. However, ancient Egyptians were largely responsible for defining time as western cultures know it now, devising the notions of hours and days as temporal units, as well as establishing the social norms by which people related to time.

Ancient societies were tied closely to their land. The Egyptians, being familiar with the seasons and the fluctuations in climate and tides associated with the great Nile River, became aware of time's cyclical nature. By observing and marking the cycle of the Nile's rising and receding, the cycle of seasons were defined and farming could become more predictable and successful. They developed a 365-day calendar, divided into three seasons: "the time of inundation (flooding), sowing time, and harvest time." Each season had a duration of four months, so the entire year totaled 12 months.

They developed a concept of time based on a "succession of recurring phases," which we refer to as seasons. They recognized the cycle of birth, life, death, and rebirth as the first element of time and formed the framework into which other units of time could be set. They believed that death was merely a doorway into the next life.

From these concepts, Egyptians worked their way into smaller and smaller units, reducing time to mere fractions. Their method of counting was based upon a base 12 system: using the three joints in the four fingers of the hand. They were responsible for dividing the daylight period into twelve parts and the night was similarly divided, making a single day into a cycle of 24 hours, a unit for marking the passage of time. Dawn started each day and specific activities were designated in their temples throughout the day. Ancient Egyptians also relied heavily on the changing positions of the stars to measure time at night.

While ancient Egyptians credited their gods and goddesses with giving them the gift of knowledge and understanding of time, they were responsible for identifying and defining the units of time according to which most of the world operate today.
